Two York Teams Participate in the Junior Achievement Titans Business Challenge.



On Tuesday May 21, team York2 and York5 participated in the annual Junior Achievement Titan Business Challenge held at St. John Fisher College. Students from Mr. MacKenzie's classes used an interactive computer program to simulate operating a business and competed against teams from other schools. This activity provided students with a hands-on program that utilized entrepreneurial and critical thinking skills, while providing an opportunity for students to learn from successful business leaders that served as team mentors. Over 100 teams competed from more than a dozen local high schools in the Rochester area.

A Note from the School Nurse

New York State law requires a health examination for all students entering the school district for the first time and when entering Pre-K or K, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th and 11th grade and yearly in grades 7-12 when playing a sport. The examination must be completed by a New York State licensed physician, physician assistant or nurse practitioner. A dental certificate which states your child has been seen by a dentist or dental hygienist is also asked for at the same time. The school will provide you with a list of dentists and registered dental hygienists who offer dental services on a free or reduced cost basis if you ask for it.

A copy of the health examination must be provided to the school within 30 days from when your child first starts at the school, and when your child starts Pre-K or K, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th & 11th grades. If a copy is not given to the school within 30 days, the school will contact you. If your child has an appointment for an exam during this school year that is after the first 30 days of school, please notify the Health Office with the date.

Communication between private and school health staff is important for safe and effective care at school. Your healthcare provider may not share health information with school health staff without your signed permission. Please talk to your provider about signing their consent form for the school at the time of your child's appointment for the examination. We suggest you make copies of the completed forms for your own records before sending them to the school health office. Forms may also be faxed to 585-243-4267.

Immunization Requirements:

- All 6th grade students who are 11 years old **MUST HAVE** proof of having been given Tdap vaccine (shot) in order to attend school.
- All 7th-10th and 12th grade students **MUST HAVE** proof of having been given Meningococcal vaccine (shot) in order to attend school.
- Students entering Grade 7th-10th must have 1 dose of meningococcal vaccine. They will be required to get a booster at age 16.
- Students entering Grade 12 in 2019 must have either:
 - 2 doses of meningococcal vaccine with the booster dose given on or after age 16
 - 1 dose if your child's first dose was given on or after age 16.

New York State law requires parents/ guardians to give the school an immunization (shot) record that shows their child has received, or has appointment(s) to receive the required vaccine(s) (shots) in order to attend school.
